

# English 12/Art Integrated Art Final

For your final, you must create an artwork and artist statement in response to one of the prompts below. This final will be worth 20% of your grade.

Please choose from one of the following options:

1. Choose one of the artists presented in the “Stories” episode of Art21. Research the artist (see resources below) and create an artwork that tells a story about your life. Your work should reflect the artist’s process, style and/or themes.

## **Resources:**

*When you research your chosen artist, make sure to watch the Art21 video(s) about them, look at their artwork and read the articles/interviews about them on the Art21 site. But also do additional research via web searches, etc.*

2. Create an artwork that presents your essential question from your Senior Exhibition to an audience. Your work should reference some of your Senior Ex research as well as any insights you may have at this point. Media is your choice.
  3. Create a monoprinted or collaged work of art that serves as a portrait of a person of your choice. The portrait can be abstract or representational but should reflect the identity of the subject in specific ways. It should contain multiple layers of printing or collage and can incorporate other media.

**Your artwork must:**

- Be a completed work of art and “gallery ready”
- Reflect the prompt and your ideas in a thoughtful, creative and detailed way
- Be well composed, clear to understand and purposeful
- Have strong craftsmanship
- See rubric

**No matter what option you chose, an artist statement must accompany it. Your statement should:**

- Include the following information:
  - Explain your project (What is your idea and how did you make it? How are you addressing the prompt?)
  - Analyze your project (How is your project conveying your idea? What meaning and/or symbolism are you representing?)
  - Evaluate your project (Where were you successful? Where do you have room for improvement and how would you improve it if you were given the opportunity?)
- Be at least 3 paragraphs.
- Be thoughtfully written, with specific details about your project and choices.
- Have strong craftsmanship (spelling, grammar, etc.)
- See rubric

**Your final is due by Friday, December 20 by the end of the day.**

- Artworks should be turned into the designated area in the art room
- Statements should be EMAILED! to Mrs. Pratt or printed and turned in with your artwork.

No exceptions, no late work accepted. Remember that your final is worth 20% of your grade!
